

Hard to believe this lovable puppy was scheduled to be enthanized....

Meet Daisy (we've nicknamed her Daisy Dollop to distinguish her from the Wounded Paw Project® founder who is also named Daisy!). Daisy was a rescue that lived with what she thought was her fur-ever family for over 10 years. Recently, Daisy began exhibiting anxiety and was no longer fitting into the family's busy schedule of work and



children's school activities. So instead of working through Daisy's anxiety issues (by training or adjusting Daisy's environment to ease her anxiety), the family thought the easiest thing for them to do was to schedule an out of state vet appointment to have her put down. Why out of state? Because Daisy's normal veterinarian would never have agreed to put Daisy down. That's when Wounded Paw Project® got a call from Daisy's owner's elderly father to see if there was anything we could do to rehome Daisy.

From the minute Daisy arrived at the sanctuary, she fit in immediately. She loves playing with the other doggies on site, running up and down the hills on the property, taking naps, and eating her favorite treats. We have yet to witness any of the behavioral problems Daisy's owner cited as her reasons to euthanize Daisy.

We're so glad Daisy was saved! And it was all because of the Wounded Paw family-YOU!

But here's the sad part, Daisy is only one of many dogs facing death because they've become an inconvenience to their owners. We could use your help finding homes for these doggies that need a second tail in life®. If you are interested in opening your home to one of these

HOMEMADE WOOF LOAF

We found this recipe on pop sugar.com and we know your pup will love it... especially the surprise treat inside of hard boiled eggs!

Ingredients

TI MILLION

- 1 pound of lean ground turkey
- 1/2 cup of chopped carrots
- 1/2 cup of peas
- 1/2 cup of oats
- 2 raw eggs
- 3 hard-boiled eggs
- 1. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. In a bowl, mix together the lean turkey, carrots, and peas.

3. Add the oats and raw eggs. Mix until the loaf mixture comes together. Lightly grease a loaf pan with olive oil and then add half the mixture to the pan.

4. Place the three hard-boiled eggs along the center of the loaf and then cover with the other half of the ground turkey mixture. Bake in the oven for 45 minutes.

5. Cut a half-inch slice from the cooled loaf and let your pet enjoy!

THIS MONTH, SADIE WANTS TO REMIND YOU THAT THE UNITED STATES WILL EXPERIENCE A TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE ON MONDAY, APRIL 8, 2024. WHILE PETS DON'T NORMALLY STARE UP AT THE SUN, IT'S IMPORTANT TO MONITOR THE BEHAVIOR OF YOUR PET DURING THE ECLIPSE. PETS MAY GET CONFUSED BECAUSE IT'S DARKER THAN NORMAL OUTSIDE AND BEGIN TO EXHIBIT ANXIETY AND OTHER ODD BEHAVIOR. AS FOR HUMANS, DON'T STARE DIRECTLY AT THE ECLIPSE WITHOUT SPECIAL EYE PROTECTION. ANIMAL ABUSE IS A PRECURSOR FOR A LIFE OF CRIME INVOLVING HUMAN TRAFFICKING, SERIAL KILLING, SCHOOL SHOOTINGS, AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE

On Monday, April 8, 2024, the United States is expect to experience a total solar eclipse. It will be

visible along a narrow stretch between Texas and Maine known as the "totality track". Within this track, the moon will entirely cover the sun and will result in a brief period of total darkness akin to nighttime. There are 12 VA National Cemetaries that fall within in this track. They are:

- Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery, San Antonio, TX
- San Antonio National Cemetery, San Antonio, TX
- Kerrville National Cemetery, Kerrville, TX
- Dallas-Fort Worth National Cemetery, Dallas, TX
- Fort Smith National Cemetery, Fort Smith, AR
- Little Rock National Cemetery, Little Rock, AR
- Mound City National Cemetery, Mound City, IL
- Crown Hill National Cemetery, Indianapolis, IN
- Marion National Cemetery, Marion, IN
- Dayton National Cemetery, Dayton, OH
- Ohio Western Reserve National Cemetery, Seville, OH
- Western New York National Cemetery, Corfu, NY

These cemeteries will be open for the entirety of their business hours; however, committal and memorial services will not take place during the totality of the eclipse.




